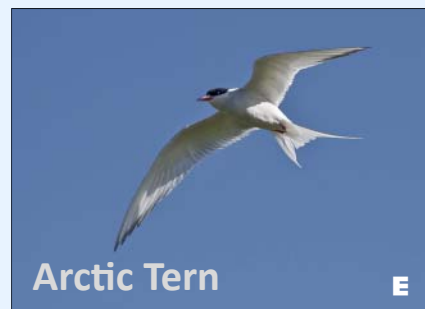


## Winged Seafarers!
